



Statement of regulatory action

26 November 2024

The Australian Skills Quality Authority (ASQA) has cancelled the registration of International Institute of Education and Training Pty Ltd (IIET, trading as EDU VET 40993) as part of its ongoing program of regulatory action.

IIET was registered to deliver training and assessment to domestic students and was not funded by government to deliver VET qualifications.

Effective from 21 November 2024, ASQA's decision to cancel the registration of IIET was based on finding it had issued qualifications without appropriate training or competency-based assessment by qualified assessors.

Given the nature of the issues identified in this matter, and to ensure public confidence in the qualifications gained through Australia's VET sector, ASQA has begun the process to consider the cancellation of qualifications issued by IIET from January 2023.

Notices of intent to cancel qualifications have been sent to 6818 former students of IIET.

The impacted former students of the provider collectively hold a variety of qualifications across individual support, disability, aged care and community services and first aid.

ASQA continues to work collaboratively with other government agencies and state and territory governments and regulators in relation to the impact of these actions on former students, as well as any workplaces affected.

ASQA is committed to lifting quality and integrity across the VET sector and the integrity of our qualifications is a primary focus. There is no place for any provider who seeks to undermine the sector or exploit students

ASQA's ongoing program of regulatory action has also seen it cancel the registration of an unrelated RTO - Gills College Australia Pty Ltd (Gills College, trading as Elite College Australia and/or Sterling Business College 2417/01701G) - effective 21 November and notices of intent to cancel qualifications have also been sent to 3364 former students of Gills College.

Earlier this month ASQA also cancelled the qualifications of more than 7300 former students of Luvium Pty Ltd (trading as Australia Education & Career College).

The decisions are part of an ongoing program of regulatory action supported by ASQA's strengthened capacity to target illegal behaviour and non-genuine providers that threaten the integrity of VET.
